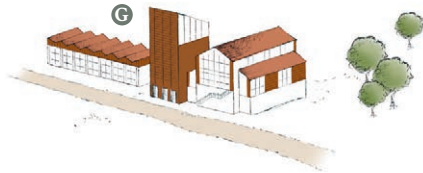
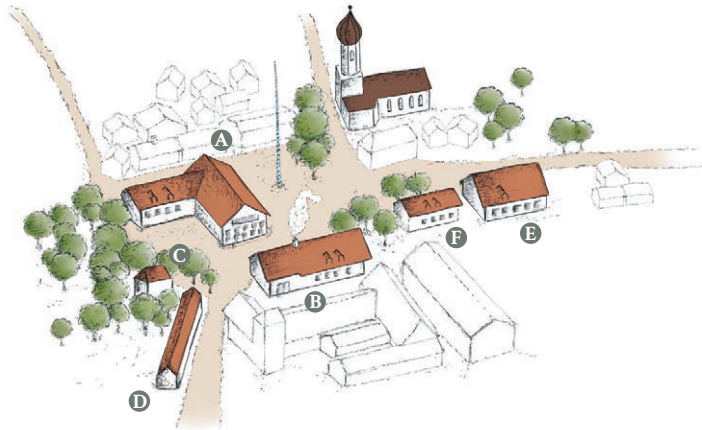
SUITED FOR ANY OCCASION

The superior 4-star hotel Brauereigasthof Hotel Aying is situated in the heart of the village of Aying, a community in Upper Bavaria some 25 kilometres southeast of Munich, the state capital.

The historical ensemble is one of a kind: surrounded by authentic ambience, you can enjoy the fine cuisine in our restaurant or Bavarian specialities in our brewery tavern.

But this is a place where you will also find a unique setting for private festivities and professional conventions. And those who are interested can round off the celebrations with a tour of the hotel's own brewery.

The best way to experience Aying and its surroundings is to start right at the hotel's doorstep. Our very own hiking map will guide you on numerous tours to the most beautiful lookout points and most interesting places around Aying in the gorgeous Upper Bavarian foothills of the Alps.

OUR INN

The first official mention of restaurant operations in Aying was in 1385. Today, our inn is the hub of our ensemble: it contains 34 rooms of a total of 48 rooms – all individually decorated with loving attention to detail – four of our event rooms for up to 180 persons and our restaurant, which has received multiple awards.



OUR RESTAURANT

The restaurant at the Brauereigasthof Hotel Aying offers top-notch dining in an elegant yet cosy ambience. Sophisticated, fine dishes are composed – inspired by particular products and ingredients from the region and the hotel's own hunting activities. The creations from the kitchen are accompanied by select beverages, first and foremost, of course, are the Aying beer specialities from the inn's own brewery; and the ice-age mineral water is from the inn's own spring.

In the summertime, the Innkeeper's Garden is the favourite amongst our restaurant guests. Idyllically situated, it is tucked away between the grain store and the inn. With its beautiful rose pergola and many cosy tables under the apple trees, our Innkeeper's Garden is the idea place to spend beautiful summer days and evenings.





OUR MANOR HOUSE

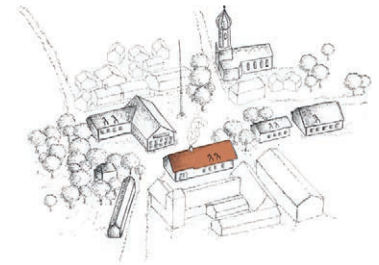
Until 2005, the manor house, a protected heritage site, was our family home; then it was converted and restored with care and opened up to our guests. Each of the 14 rooms is named after one of our family members from the past seven generations. As individual as the characters of the home's former residents, likewise every single room has its own individual decor.

A library with a stock of books from days gone by and an open fireplace, the atmospheric, generously proportioned snugery, with access to what was once the manor house kitchen, and a professionally equipped conference room make the manor house as a whole a particularly charming venue for any celebration or convention – be it for business or pleasure.

In our manor house kitchen, you can also look over our cooks' shoulders – e.g. at the chef's table right next to the stoker stove. Moreover, there is a wine cellar with a vaulted ceiling below the tavern, where we stock special French red wines. You can also book our manor house exclusively for completely private celebrations or conventions!

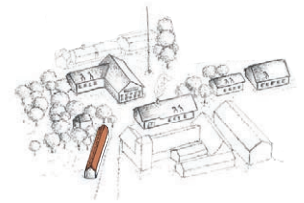
THE GRAIN STORE

Our grain store, which is approximately 300 years old, used to be situated in the neighbouring town of Peiß. Transported with care and reassembled true to the original, the wooden block construction with its log cabin ambience is the ideal venue for special occasions.



THE HISTORICAL SKITTLE ALLEY

The historic skittle alley from 1881 was once an open alley in a “Salettl”, or small conservatory, in the old beer garden. It was converted in the 1950s, making it possible to have a perfect game in winter too. Restored with tender loving care, our skittles alley is meanwhile ideally suited for extraordinary events. The pins are set up by hand, just like in the old days. A further special feature is the alley’s own little beer garden.



THE TRADITIONAL SIXTHOF FARMHOUSE

The Sixthof is one of the oldest farmhouses in the District of Munich and, to mark the occasion of the 100th anniversary of the founding of the brewery, in 1978 it was consecrated as a traditional farmhouse by Franz Inselkammer and completely furnished according to the historical model.

It is possible to view the traditional farmhouse after an enquiry made in advance. This is where one can see how people lived more than 200 years ago. For very special occasions, it is possible to book the snugery in the Sixthof farmhouse.

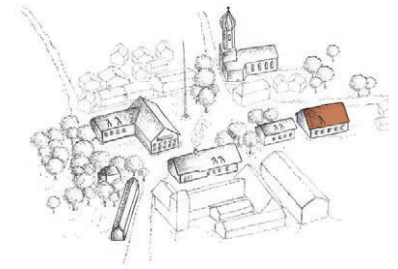


THE TRADITIONAL SIXTHOF BARN

In 2015, the rear section of the traditional farmhouse, which served as a stall back in the day, was also extensively renovated. With the Sixthof barn, further premises are available on two levels which have yet to meet their match – be it for conventions or a fabulous celebration.

AYINGER BREWERY SNUGGERY

Our Ayinger brewery snuggerly is a traditional Bavarian tavern in the best sense: get together at plain wooden tables or in the beautiful beer garden and enjoy freshly drawn Ayinger beers along with a hearty snack of bread, cold cuts and cheese and simple Bavarian fare. Beer from the wooden keg is available every day from 5.30 pm.



AYINGER PRIVATE BREWERY



Our Ayinger private brewery, founded in 1878, is led by Franz Inselkammer in the 6th generation. Remaining true to the original brewing methods, and maintaining the utmost quality and Bavarian tradition, it is one of the most-awarded breweries in the world. The ingredients for our 14 traditional varieties of beer all come from our own farm and from farmers in the area, the mineral water comes from our own ice-age spring and the yeast from our own pure culture. Thanks to this special effort, we guarantee the best original beers. You are very welcome to take a tour of our brewery – and afterwards enjoy the beer ideally under the old chestnut trees or in the cosy “Schwemm”, or watering place, in our brewery snuggery in the old village centre of Aying.

In 2014, at the European Beer Star, the Ayinger private brewery was named best brewery in Europe and is considered to be one of the best in Germany according to the most important ranking portals.

Of course, you can also celebrate in the heart of the brewery: in our “Schalander”, or brewers’ lounge, on the first floor, surrounded by brewing kettles and with a glorious view of the Ayinger fields.



LOCATION AND HOW TO GET HERE



Aying is about a 30-minute drive southeast of Munich. Munich-Salzburg Autobahn, "Hofoldingner Forst" exit, follow the signs to Aying for approx. 8 km. From Munich Airport, you can get here by car via the A 99 in about 45 minutes (approx. 65 km); from the Munich Fair ("Messe München") via the A 99 in about 25 minutes by car (approx. 30 km). By public transit ("S-Bahn"), you can get here from the Munich city centre in about 40 minutes: S7 line in the direction of Kreuzstraße to the Aying stop. From there, our Brauereigasthof Hotel Aying is about 10 minutes away on foot. We would be very happy to arrange to pick our hotel guests up at the train station.



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
